The school boundary zone for Billingsville Elementary consists of a part of 9 neighborhood profile areas (see map on reverse). A smaller percentage of residents in Billingsville Elementary feeder neighborhoods own homes compared to the county average, and a larger percentage receive food assistance. Only one feeder neighborhood has a higher incidence of juvenile arrests than the county average, and four neighborhoods have a higher percent of births to adolescents. A larger percentage of adults are struggling with un- or under-employment.

The chart to the right illustrates the demographics of the students served at Billingsville Elementary. There is a much higher percentage of economically disadvantaged students compared to the district as a whole. Billingsville Elementary students also have a higher rate of student mobility than the district average. Poverty and high mobility are correlated with low academic achievement.

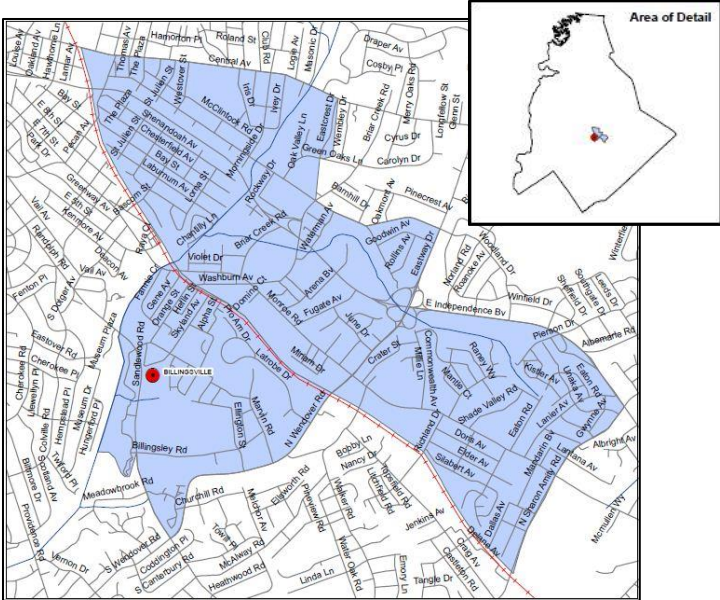

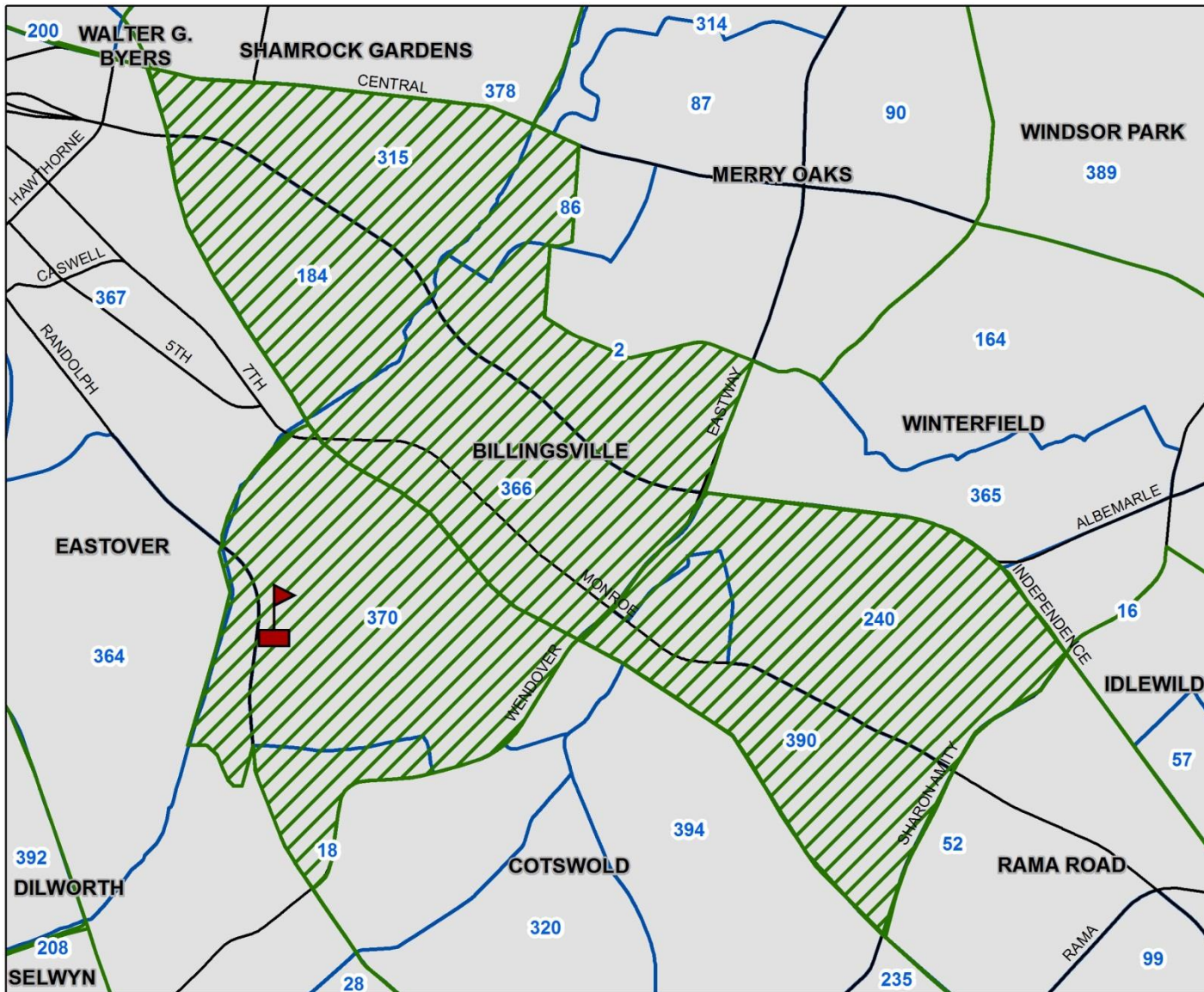

Billingsville Elementary feeder neighborhoods have a varying percentage of children on grade level and a varying dropout rate that range from lower than the county average to higher than the county average. The percentage of students with 10 or more unexcused absences is higher than the county average in all but one feeder neighborhood, indicating some risk for low academic achievement.
