The chart to the right illustrates the demographics of the students served at McClintock Middle. There is a much higher percentage of economically disadvantaged students compared to the district as a whole, and McClintock Middle School students have a rate of mobility almost twice the district average. Poverty and high mobility are correlated with low academic achievement.

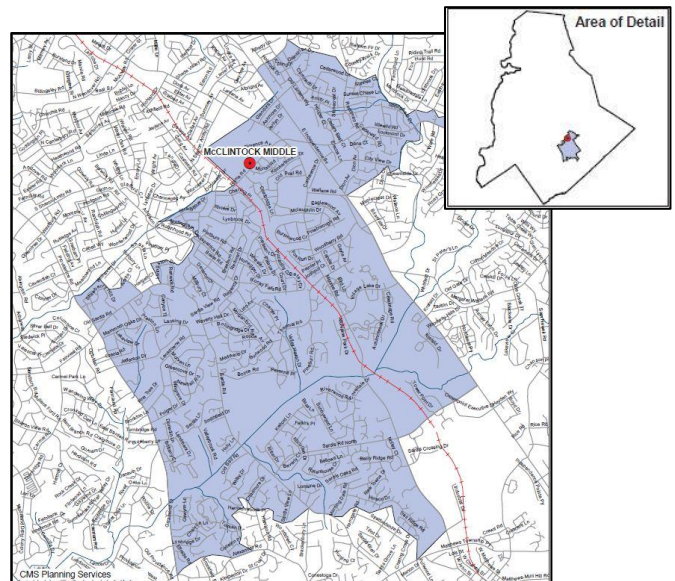

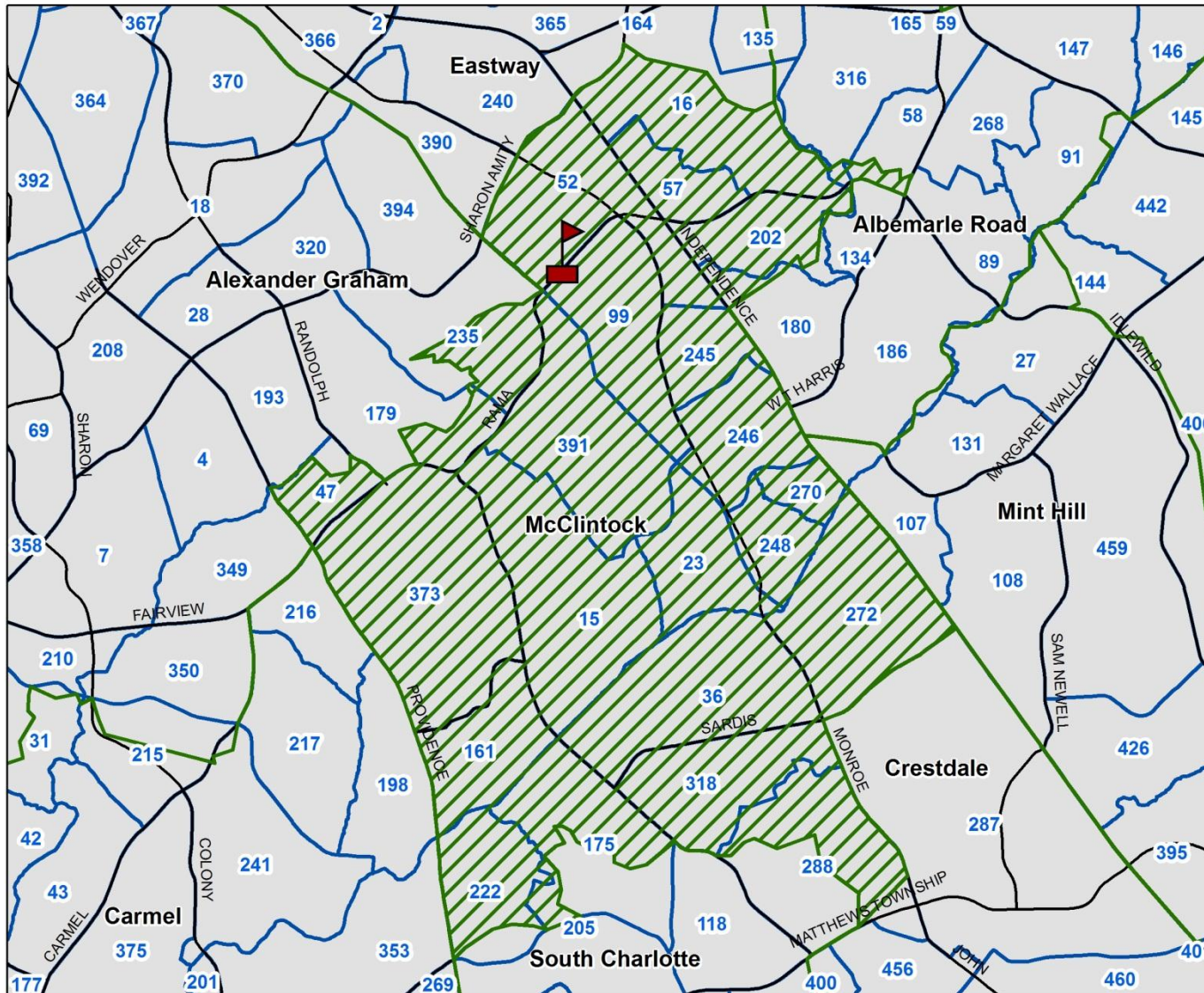

McClintock Middle feeder neighborhoods have a varied percentage of children on grade level and a dropout rate that ranges from higher than the county average to lower than the county average. The percentage of students with 10 or more unexcused absences is higher than the county average in almost half of the feeder neighborhoods, indicating some risk for low academic achievement.
